

Friday, March 10: Mr. Joseph Criscione of Kaiser Foundation met Mrs. Thatcher at her hotel and took her to Kaiser Foundation Hospital in Oakland where she met with Dr. Clifford H. Keene, Vice President and General Manager of Kaiser Hospital Foundation. Dr. Keene showed Mrs. Thatcher some of their activities and facilities and discussed the operation of the health plan. Mr. Criscione invited Mrs. Thatcher to lunch and drove her to her afternoon appointment in S.F.

Mrs. Thatcher visited Lowell High School, where she met with Mr. J. A. Perino, who is Principal of the school. Mr. Perino invited Mrs. Thatcher to his home after the school visit was over.

Saturday, March 11: In the morning, Mrs. Thatcher visited KQED-TV, Bay Area Educational Television Association, and talked with Mr. James Day, General Manager.

Mr. and Mrs. Jay Gittlesohn, IHC, took her on a tour of S.F. and to see the American Conservatory Theater production of "Tartuffe" that evening. Mrs. Thatcher raved about "Tartuffe," superb presentation.

Sunday, March 12: Miss Aileen Olsen, IHC, took Mrs. Thatcher on a tour of Marin County and Muir Woods and invited her to her home for dinner.

Monday, March 13 - University of California:

1. Appointment with Dr. Thomas C. Blaisdell, Jr., Professor of Political Science (emeritus).
2. Appointment followed by luncheon with Dr. Earl Rolph, Professor of Economics.

Mrs. Thatcher went directly from the University to the airport to fly to Los Angeles.

COMMENT: Mrs. Thatcher, who is an extremely charming person, was very enthusiastic about her visit to the Bay Area. In fact, she was one of the most enthusiastic grantees the program officer had the pleasure of working with. She was kept very busy and found her appointments most interesting and enlightening. 

NARRATIVE REPORT:

Mrs. Thatcher's visit to New York went smoothly. Her program wishes were clearly spelled out by GAI and the people with whom I arranged appointments, prepared as they were to show her every courtesy, could hardly bear to part with her once she actually met and charmed them. Thus lunch at the Guaranty Trust scheduled for 2 hours lasted 3 and was cut short even then as she had to move on to the Federal Reserve. Lunch at the First National City Bank did not end with dessert but continued until 4 p.m.

A Mrs. McMoran on whom Mrs. Thatcher relied to entertain her during an evening or two was not to be in town. ~~This lady had to be in her house near Albany and she arranged for a meeting with Governor Rockefeller in that city as well as tea with Mrs. Rockefeller at the Governor's Mansion.~~ I do not know whether the meeting with the Governor actually took place, given the rate of speed at which he travels and revises his schedule.

Mrs. Thatcher prolonged her stay with friends in Montclair, New Jersey until late Sunday, March 26. In addition to the appointments listed in my letter, [†] she also met with Mr. and Mrs. Paul Wright; he is Director of British Information Services in New York and she is an old friend of the grantee's and a former M.P.

I had called Mrs. Thatcher in Chicago to ask whether she was willing to go to Albany for the day and to discuss her program in general. She sounded so disappointed that Mrs. McMoran would not be here to take her to the Metropolitan Opera that I took her myself.
