STATEMENT ON THE DEFENCE ESTIMATES 1980

Note by the Secretary of State for Defence

- 1. I attach for early consideration by the Committee the draft of my Statement on the Defence Estimates for 1980.
- 2. Volume I of the draft sets out our policy for defence, describes the make-up and deployment of our defence forces, and explains the reasons for both all in some detail. It seeks to offer a much more coherent basic explanation of policy and roles than the Statements of our predecessors. I have emphasised the importance we attach to defence, and pointed up our approach to important areas of policy such as nuclear weapons (which our predecessors artificially played down), the Soviet threat to our interests outside the NATO area, and our determination to ensure that the Services receive proper rewards and public recognition. I have done this in the light of the Committee's discussion in December. I have expressed a positive attitude to the defence programme throughout the Statement, but without giving particular hostages to fortune. I have been frank about the problems we face, including the possible effect of economic factors.
- 3. Volume II of the draft contains a great deal of statistical data about defence, which will both support the account of our defence activity in Volume I, and be interesting in itself. Many of the tables have been published previously in a piecemeal

which but some present new information and this is the first defence data of this kind have been put together under one

Those the Committee will agree that this Statement on the sence Estimates for 1980 successfully projects the fresh to defence to which we are committed, and that it does which will encourage a well-informed public in a way which will in turn engender a wider sension of defence, which will in turn engender a wider sension of the purpose of our defence capability and the first necessary to sustain it.
