1. Introduction


The results from the latest 'tracking' study conducted from 1st to 6th December do not fully confirm the results of the previous study conducted from 24th to 29th November which found a 5% jump in the level of Conservative support. This latest study found 43% claiming they would vote Conservative (46½% in the previous study), 35% Labour (32% in the previous study), 9% Liberal (7½% in the previous study) and 11% Social Democrat (11½% in the previous study). The Conservative lead over Labour fell from 14½% to 8%. The combined level of Liberal and Social Democrat support stands at 20% - a similar level to that found in tracking studies since early November. The current level of Alliance support of 20% compares with 42% at the start of the year.

Details of the trend of support for the main parties since the start of the year are shown overleaf and in the attached graph.

2. Government Record

The latest study found 42% approving of our record in government (23% in early January) and 47% disapproving (65% in early January) and 11% with no view (12% in early January).

3. Popularity of Political Leaders

This latest study found a slight fall in Mrs Thatcher's popularity and an increase in Mr Foot's popularity and in that of Mr Steel. Gallup found 45% claiming to be satisfied with Mrs Thatcher as Prime Minister, 23% claiming to be satisfied with Mr Foot as Leader of the Opposition, 62% satisfied with Mr Steel as Leader of the Liberals and 35% satisfied with Mr Jenkins as Leader of the Social Democrats.

Details of the trend of popularity for Mrs Thatcher, Mr Foot and Mr Steel are shown below:-

4. Published Polls

(a) MORI (Sunday Times Magazine 12th December 1982)

The Sunday Times Magazine on 12th December included details of a MORI survey on attitudes to Channel 4 conducted in late November. The survey found 25% taking the view that the arrival of Channel 4 has raised the quality of the material they see on TV, 58% think it has made no difference and 15% think the change has been for the worse.
