Note of meeting of CPS Management Board held on July 26th, 1977

Present: KJ, NV, AS, GF, SW, AR, and for part of meeting, PK.

Apologies from MB.

- GF's minute of meeting on June 23rd was read and approved.
- 2) Matters arising: Reporting on the appeal to donors NV said that only two donors had declined the request for further financial support.
- 3) Reporting on the work of the specialist committees AS said that the energy committee was progressing very well; its members would be producing papers on different aspects of the problem by September. After a period of gestation the transport committee was now also off the ground with Keith Williams as chairman. The first meeting would be on August 16th.
- 4a) Describing progress of the CPS publishing programme, AS and PK said the Max Wilkinson's 'Lessons for a Europe' had received highly favourable treatment in the media. We insteak was to prepare a foreword to Quinn. AS asked KJ to write a foreword to JBG's study of Meriden. Colin Clark's Study of Cities not suitable for publication by CPS.
- 4b) PK said Macmillans had offered to publish Quinn. However, RAP had rejected offer. Since Quinn was among the most commercially viable of our publications, there was no reason why a commercial publisher should cream off the results of our h bours. There was no reason why CPS could not distribute and promote the book at least as well as Macmillans.
- 5) NV said that the average manual wage, as calculated by Dept. of Employment, was an overastimate. As a result it encouraged workers earning less that this wholly notional figure to push up wage demands. It was agreed that before departing RM should propage a brief preliminary paper setting out the conceptual basis of the figures.

- 6) GF said that Prof. Peter Bauer had agreed to be one of our two speakers at the CPS fringe meeting at Blackpool. Arianna Stassinopoulos had also been invited. Bauer had requested a non party-political chairman, preferably Frank McFadzean. Other names suggested: Hugh Thomas, Julius Gould, Charles Carter.
- 7) The date of the next CPS Board Meeting is Tuesday, September at 11 a.m. followed by lunch.
