HENRY GRUNWALD, EDITOR-IN-CHIEF TIME MAGAZINE: TUESDAY 1100 HOURS

The Prime Minister will see Henry Grunwald for 30 minutes at 1100 hours on Tuesday. This will be a background, off-the-record session. Grunwald is Editor-in-Chief of all Time publications but exercises particular editorial influence over Time and Fortune.

Grunwald is a frequent visitor to Europe. However, the main reason for this visit is to attend the operetta "Countess Maritza" at Sadlers Wells which was written by his father before the family emigrated to the States from Vienna.

Grunwald is likely to be particularly interested in the nuclear debate and the health of the Alliance (he had separate sessions last month with Kohl and Mitterrand); but he will also be interested in the domestic political scene post-Bermondsey.

Grunwald's career at Time has been meteoric: after leaving University he began as a copy boy; before becoming Editor-in-Chief of the Group he was Managing Editor of Time Magazine. He is a good contact of B.I.S. New York who frequently arrange for visiting Ministers to see Senior Editors at Time.
