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## Public Opinion Background Note 156/157

(produced 19th April 1983)

### 1. Introduction

Gallup conducted the interviewing for our latest 'tracking' study from 31st March to 5th April. The survey involved interviews with 893 people throughout Great Britian. Compared with the results of the previous published Gallup study (conducted 17/21 March) this latest study found a sharp increase in Labour support - up from 28½% to 36%. Conservative support also increased slightly - from 39½% to 42%. Our lead over Labour fell from 11.0% (17/21 March) to 6% in the latest study (31st March/5th April). Alliance support fell from 28% to 21% over the same period.

Details of the trend of support for the main parties in our Gallup studies since the start of the year are shown overleaf:-

# 2. Government Record

The latest study found a fall in Government popularity compared with the latest published Gallup survey - the proportion of the electorate approving of the record of the Government fell from 41% to 39%, although the proportion disapproving remained constant at 48%.

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# 3. Popularity of Political Leaders

The latest study found a slight fall in Mrs Thatcher's popularity when compared both with the last published Gallup study and the first Gallup study in 1982. The study found 45% claiming to be satisfied with Mrs Thatcher as Prime Minister, 50% dissatisfied and 5% not having a view - comparative figures at the start of 1983 showed 48% claiming to be satisfied with Mrs Thatcher as Prime Minister, 47% dissatisfied and 6% not having a view.

Mr Foot remains slightly more popular than in early January, as does Mr Steel. Mr Jenkin's popularity remains almost unchanged.

#### 4. Published Polls

### (a) MORI (Daily Express 29th March)

The Daily Express on 29th March included details of a MORI poll on attitudes to Mrs Thatcher. The survey was conducted from 17th to 23rd March. The survey (conducted before Darlington) found 43% claiming they would vote Conservative, 28% Labour, 28% SDP/Liberal and 1% for 'others'.

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MORI asked Conservative supporters why they claimed they would support us. The findings are:-

### (b) MORI (Daily Express 12th April 1983)

The Daily Express on 12th April included details of a MORI poll conducted from April 8t to 9th on women's attitudes to the Greenham Common protest.

When MORI asked women for their opinion of the peace protestors 58% of women had an 'unfavourable' view (51% of men), 22% supported them (31% of men) and 20% had no opinion (18% of men).

## (c) System Three (Glasgow Herald 22nd March 1983)

The Glasgow Herald on 22nd March included details of a System Three poll conducted in Scotland from February 25th to March 7th. The survey found 47% claiming they will vote Labour, 22% Conservative, 18% Alliance and 13% SNP.

Details of the trend of support in Scotland are shown overleaf:-

Conservative support in Scotland has fallen by 8 percentage points since February and Alliance support has increased by 7 percentage points.
