On this principle Mr Nott will replace Mr Pym as a member of the Ministerial Group on Nuclear Defence Policy (MISC 7). I think it is for consideration whether Mr Pym might be invited to continue as a member of this Committee, as well as Mr Nott. The knowledge which he has already acquired on nuclear defence policy, coupled with the close relationship with the House of Commons which stems from his new post, are arguments in favour of this course of action. Mr Pym will not have the support of any staff in this field, and we should have to make arrangements like those we have made for Mr Whitelaw for the protection of papers and the provision of briefing. I know that Mr Pym will have other heavy preoccupations, and it has always been considered desirable to keep this Committee as small as possible. Nevertheless the Prime Minister may like to consider inviting Mr Pym to remain a member of it.
