Nationalised Industries: Cabinet Committee

When Ministers discussed the CPRS report on nationalised industries on 4th August, they agreed that there should be a new Committee to consider issues of nationalised industry policy, which the Prime Minister would chair, with the Chancellor of the Exchequer deputising for her as appropriate; and that the Ministerial Committee should be supported by a small review staff in the CPRS.

- 2. This minute makes proposals for establishing the new Committee.
- 3. I propose that the new Committee should be formally a sub-committee of the Ministerial Committee on Economic Strategy, but without any formal obligation to report to the main Committee.
 - 4. For terms of reference I propose:
 "To keep under review the Government's general policy towards the nationalised industries and major publicly-owned companies, to consider the objectives and monitor the performance of each

of them, and to deal as necessary with specific major issues affecting them."

5. For composition I propose:

Chancellor of the Exchequer

Secretary of State for the Environment 1

Secretary of State for Scotland

Secretary of State for Trade

Secretary of State for Transport

Chief Secretary, Treasury

CONFIDENTIAL I propose that the head of the CPRS and the head of the new nationalised industry review staff in the CPRS should attend meetings of the new committee. It is for consideration whether, when the affairs of a particular nationalised industry are to be discussed, the Secretary of State concerned should be free to be accompanied, if he wishes, by the head of the Departmental unit which Unusud. deals with that industry. The Sub-committee on Nationalised Industry Financing (E(NF)) will be 7. superseded by the new committee, and so will the Ministerial Group on Rolls Royce (MISC 22); but the Sub-Committees of E on Disposals (E(DL)) and Procurement Policy (E(PU)) will need to be retained. It may prove to be convenient to set up an Official Committee, under Cabinet Office or CPRS chairmanship, to support the new Ministerial Committee; but I think that we should wait and see if that seems likely to be useful.
