FUTURE OF HONG KONG: EXCO DISCUSSION

- 1. AT TODAY'S EXCO MEETING SHR S Y CHUNG GAVE A BRHEF ACCOUNT OF THE CONVERSATION WITH NONA DIRECTOR XU JIATUN REPORTED IN MY TELSNOS 1456 AND 1457. A RECORD OF THE CONVERSATION WAS ALSO CIRCULATED.
- 2. MEMBERS WERE INTRIGUED BY XU'S REFERENCE TO THE POSSIBILITY OF SELLING LAND ON THE NEW TERRITORIES FOR PERIODS EXTENDING BEYOND 1997. SOME THOUGHTHIS WAS ESSENTIALLY A PERIPHERAL ASSUE AND THAT THE EFFECT ON CONFIDENCE WOULD BE COMPARATEVELY SMALL EVEN OF THE CHIMESE WERE PREPARED TO AGREE TO SOME SUCH ARRANGEMENT. OTHERS SAW XU'S REMARKS AS AN UNDICATION THAT THE CHIMESE ARE SERIOUSLY WOPRIED ABOUT THE HONG KONG ECONOMY AND THE DOLLAR AND THAT THEY MAY SEE A NEED FOR SOME CONCRETE ACTION TO STAPILISE THE SITUATION ON THE SHORT TERM. SIP S Y CHUNG (WHOSE INTERPRETATION AS SET OUT IN MY SECOND TELEGRAM UNDER REFERENCE) SUGGESTED THAT A CHECK SHOULD BE MADE ON PEKING TO SEE WHETHER XU WAS AUTHORISED TO SPEAK AS HE DID, AND OF SO WHAT THE CHIMESE HAVE ON MIND.
- 3. I SEE ADVANTAGE ON SEEKING CLARIFICATION QUICKLY. THERE WILL OTHERWISE BE A RISK THAT THE POSSIBILITY OF ACTION ON LAND LEASES WILL COLOUR THE THINKING OF SOME AT LEAST OF THE UNOFFICIALS WHEN

THEY MEET MINISTERS LATER THAS WEEK, AND MF THE CHINESE WERE TO BE READY TO REVERSE THE IR VIEW ON THAS ASSUE MT WOULD BE NO BAD THE THEREFORE RECEOMMEND THAT THE EMBASSY SHOULD BE MASTRUCTED TO PAISE THE MATTER ANFORMALLY WITH A MEMBER OF THE CHINESE NEGOTIATING TEAM AS SOON AS POSSIBLE, ON THE FOLLOWING LINES:

- (A) IN A CONVERSATION WITH SIR S Y CHUNG AND MR Q W LEE ON 30 SEPTEMBER THE FIRST DIRECTOR OF THE NCNA HAN HONG KONG SAID THAT IF A MEANS COULD BE FOUND FOR LAND IN THE NEW TERRITORNES TO BE SOLD FOR PERIODS EXTENDING BEYOND 1997 THIS WOULD SERVE TO RESTORE CONFIDENCE IN THE PROPERTY MARKET. HE DID NOT ELABORATE BUT LEFT SIR S Y CHUNG AND MR LEE WITH THE IMPRESSION THAT HE HAD SOME FORMULA IN MIND.
- (B) ON 5 JULY 1979 SIR P CARDOCK PUT FORWARD A PROPOSAL TO THE FOREIGN MINISTRY WHICH WOULD HAVE ENABLED INDIVIDUAL LAND LEASES IN THE NEW TERRITORIES TO BE GRANTED FOR PERIODS EXTENDING BEYOND 1997. IN THEIR REPLY DELIVERED TO THE AMBASSADOR ON 24 SEPTEMBER 1979 THE FOREIGN MINISTRY INDICATED THAT THE CHINESE GOVERNMENT RECARDED THE FROPOSED MEASURES AS UNNECESSARY AND IMAPPHOPRIATE.
- (C) WE WERE THEREFORE FUZZLED BY MR XU'S REMARKS. IT WOULD BE HELPFUL TO KNOW WHETHER THE CHINESE HAVE RECONSIDERED THEMR EARLIER VIEW AND, IF SO, WHAT ACTION THEY HAVE IN MIND.

YOUR TELNOS 998, 999 AND 1001: FUTURE OF HONG KONG: DESCUSSION WITH EXCO.

- 1. EXCO DESCUSSED THE POSETHION THES MORNING ON THE BASINS OF THE PAPER IN YOUR SECOND TEL UNDER REF. IN EXPLAINED THAT THE PAPER HAD BEEN PRODUCED TO HELP MEMBERS PREPARE FOR THE DISCUSSIONS WITH MINISTERS LATER THUS WEEK. IT DELIBERATELY CONTAINED NO CONCLUSIONS OR RECOMMENDATIONS AND MINISTERS HAD SO FAR EXPRESSED NO VIEWS ON THE OPTIONS DESCRIBED IN HET. AFTER TAKING MEMBERS THROUGH EACH IN ASKED THEM NOT TO REACH DEFINITE CONCLUSIONS OR OFFER FORMAL ADVICE UNTIL THEY HAD BEEN ABLE TO DISCUSS THE SATUATION WITH MINISTERS. IF THEN INVITED ANY PRELIMINARY COMMENTS THEY WISHED TO MAKE, AND SUGGESTIONS FOR ADDITIONAL OPTIONS.
- 2. WHTHOUT SPECIFICALLY SUPPORTING OPTION D, MR O.V. CHEUNG AND MR D.K. NEWBINGTHIS THOUGHT THAT SOME WAY SHOULD BE FOUND TO GET A GENUINE DHALOGUE GOING IN ORDER TO EXPLORE THE CHINESE POSITION FURTHER. ALL THE OTHER UNOFFICIALS MADE CLEAR THAT THEIR CHOICE WILL BE OPTION A. THEY ACCEPTED THAT THERE WAS A MORE THAN EVEN RISK OF A BREAKDOWN AND OF PUBLIC CONFRONTATION, BUT TOOK THE VIEW THAT THERE WAS AT LEAST A CHANCE THAT THE CHINESE WOULD SHIFT THEMR POSITION AND RETURN TO THE MEGOTIMATING TABLE WHEN THEY SAW THE ECONOMIC CONSEQUENCES FOR HONG KONG. REMINDERS OF THE REGIDITY OF THE CHINESE POSITION, THE LIKELY HOSTILATY OF THE CHINESE REACTION, AND THE DIFFICULTIES WHICH HONG KONG MIGHT THEN FACE LEFT THEM UNMOVED. IN ANY CASE THEY BELIEVED THAT THE PURSUIT OF ANY OTHER COURSE WOULD LEAD TO A CRISIS OF CONFIDENCE SOONER OR LATER AND THAT THE RISKS

- DUNN FOR EXAMPLE COMMENTED THAT ALL THE OPTHONS OTHER THAN

 OPTHON A WERE DIRECTLY, OR BY AMPLICATION, FORMS OF CAPATULATION).

 SOME OF THESE MEMBERS, ANCLUDING SIR S.Y. CHUNG, SUGGESTED THAT

 IF THE CHINESE MADE PROPOSALS ON THE LINES OF OPTHON B OR D THE

 BRITISH NEGOTIATORS SHOULD BE PREPARED TO LINSTEN. THEY GAVE NO

 INDICATION HOW THEY THOUGHT THE CHINESE MIGHT BE IMPUCED TO PUT

 FORWARD SUCH PROPOSALS: BUT WERE SURE THAT THE BRITISH SIDE

 SHOULD MAKE NO FURTHER CONCESSIONS.
 - PREFERENCE AMONG THE OPTHONS. BUT HE ASKED EACH MEMBER TO CONSIDER VERY SER-HOUSLY THE HAPL-ICATHONS OF HAS OR HER PREFERRED COURSE OF ACTION, HITS CONSEQUENCES AND WHAT HIT WAS LIKELY TO ACHIEVE, BEFORE GIVING ADVINCE TO MINHISTERS.
 - 4. WHILE THIS WAS STILL A PRELIMINARY DUSCUSSION, THE VIEWS EXPRESSED BY THE UNOFFICIALS WERE CLEAR. UNLESS MINISTERS ARGUE POSITIVELY FOR SOME OTHER OPTHON WHILE WE ARE IN LONDON, IN HAVE NO DOUBT THAT THE MAJORITY ADVINCE WILL BE TO STICK TO OPTHON A: AND INDEED IN THE LIGHT OF THIS MORNING'S DISCUSSION THAS IN LUKELY TO BE THEIR ADVINCE IN ANY CASE.

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
