Anti-Satellite Systems and Arms Control

The Drivate Minister has considered the joint minute dated.

The Prime Minister has considered the joint minute dated
19 June from your Secretary of State and the Foreign and Commonwealth
Secretary on this subject, together with the accompanying paper.
The Prime Minister is not convinced by some of the judgements
reached, notably that an arms control regime on ASATs which hampered
the development of BMD on both sides would be in our national
interest; or that the ideal solution would be one in which ASATS
were eliminated by the effective banning of both orbital ASATs and
the US MHV. She would therefore like an early discussion with
Mr. Heseltine and Sir Geoffrey Howe. But before this, she would
like to have the restricted briefing mentioned in paragraph 14 of
the accompanying paper. I should be grateful if you could make
arrangements for this.
