THE GENERAL EXECUTIVE COUNCIL, EXECUTIVE OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THIS UNION UTTERLY CONDEMN AND SHARE YOUR OUTRAGE AT THIS BARBAROUS CRIME. WE SEND OUR GOOD WISHES TO NORMAN TEBBIT AND HIS FAMILY FOR HIS RECOVERY AND EXPRESS OUR DEEP SYMPATHY TO ALL THE VICTIMS OF THIS EVIL ACT.''
