TWO NEW VICE-CHAIRMEN FOR CONSERVATIVE PARTY

The Prime Minister, Rt Hon Margaret Thatcher, FRS, MP, has approved the appointment of two Vice-Chairmen consequent upon the Ministerial changes she announced in September.

Sir Geoffrey Finsberg, MP, will become Vice-Chairman responsible for London and will be particularly concerned with the co-ordination and presentation of the Party's case on the GLC and its abolition. He will also take the place of the late Sir Anthony Berry, MP, as Chairman of the Committee for London.

Mr James Spicer, MP, becomes Vice-Chairman responsible for the International Department. He will be concerned with the Party's relationships in the countries outside the European Community. Relations within the European Community will be the responsibility of the Chairman of the Party.

Mr David Hunt, MP, will complete his thoroughgoing revision of the Candidates' List during November, and thereafter he will relinquish the job as Vice-Chairman, (Candidates), and will be succeeded by Mr Tom Arnold, MP, who is already a Vice-Chairman.
