DELAY IN CROWN COURT TRIALS

Some delay in Crown Court trials are to be anticipated in the Midland & Oxford circuit and the North Eastern circuit.

There is a backlog of about 500 cases. Less than 50 miners' cases have been dealt with in the Crown Court so far. The attached schedule illustrates the problem areas.

The Courts Act, 1971 provides for the Lord Chancellor to determine where any Crown Court shall sit [Section 4(6)]. It would seem appropriate for emergency extra Courts to be set up and for extra or assistant judiciary to be asked to sit.
