PRIME MINISTER COAL FIRING SCHEME It was agreed earlier this year that the Coal Firing Scheme should continue until this December but should then be reviewed. Meanwhile, he wishes to leave the Scheme open. There are still a few applications coming in. The Chief Secretary agrees that the review should be postponed but in the meantime wishes to close the Scheme. The Chief Secretary's view is perfectly logical immediately after the strike the priority will be to despatch as much coal as possible to the power stations to replenish stocks, and if the closure programme is pursued vigorously, there should not be a surplus of coal which needs to be subsidised in order to encourage companies to take it up.
