Mr Harris recalled that Mr Kinnock accused Scargill three years ago of "strutting demagoguery" and "bullying" for denouncing Tony Benn's critics as traitors to socialism.

Last night Mr Kinnock's office confirmed the attacks but said he blamed the Government, not Scargill, for the coal industry's current plight.

## 'He's destroying the coal industry single-handed'
