## ITALIAN EARTHQUAKE RELIEF

## MESSAGE FROM THE PRIME MINISTER TO SIGNOR FORLANI

I am happy to be able to tell you that the British Government have decided to give a substantial number of British manufactured prefabricated buildings for use by the survivors of the terrible earthquake which struck your country in November. I understand that Signor Zamberletti considers that such buildings would be particularly welcome.

We envisage that the buildings should be provided in the first instance for the area in which British aid has so far been concentrated. The cost of the buildings and of their transport to Italy will be borne by the British Government. Our Consulate-General in Naples is already in close touch with the local authorities as well as with Signor Zamberletti's organisation and will be responsible for coordinating with them arrangements for getting the buildings to the area and installing them there.

In addition to the immediate relief which was provided by HM Government in the period immediately following the Italian earthquake, a number of British manufactured prefabricated buildings for the longer term relief of the victims are to be provided. The total cost of the additional aid will be up to £0.5 m. The arrangements for procurement and transport will be made by the Crown Agents.

The Italian Government have warmly weclomed this proposal.


## Italian Earthquake Relief

You wrote to me on 13 January to say that the Prime Minister had agreed to the proposals for further relief for the victims of the Italian earthquake disaster which were set out in my letter of 12 January. The Crown Agents are proceeding urgently with arrangements for procurement and shipment of the prefabs.

As envisaged in that letter I now attach a telegram containing a message which the Prime Minister may wish to send to the Italian Prime Minister informing him of the decision. I also attach a draft of a statement which your Press Office may wish to make once Signor Forlani has acknowledged the Prime Minister's message. We propose to instruct Sir Ronald Arculus, in handing over the message, to seek Italian views on the timing of the announcement.
