"Dear Prime Minister,

I have received the message with which you inform me of the British Government's decision to donate to the population of southern Italy stricken by the earthquake a substantial number of British-manufactured prefabricated buildings and to bear the cost of their transport to Italy.

I am most grateful for your kind thought of personally informing me of this decision and, also on behalf of the Italian People and Government, I wish to thank you most sincerely for this tangible and significant expression of solidarity which represents further evidence of the traditional friendly links which unite our two Countries.

The donation is all the more welcome since it will blend, at the present time, with the Italian Government's own program of reconstruction and redevelopment for the two regions so terribly devastated by the earthquake.

Remembering with pleasure your visit to Rome and looking forward to meeting you again in the near future, please accept, dear Prime Minister, my renewed thanks and kindest personal regards.


