GLASGOW CASE

As you know the application for a private prosecution was heard this week and the hearing concluded today.

The Court deferred judgment and I would think it will be a week or possibly two weeks before judgment is issued. Although it is only an impression gained at the hearing I consider it likely that the Court will grant the application if they are satisfied that there can be a fair trial in this case in spite of the very strong publicity which there has been about it. I think the hearing conluded with the Court not having made up its mind fully on this question. What the ultimate answer will be on this point I therefore cannot forecast.


