1. Thank you for your letter of 9 March.

- 2. We naturally look out for fresh evidence on Third World interest in the subjects on which we write, but our assessment is that there would be no detailed interest in the PCI/CPSU dispute in the Third World except former Italian territories, especially Ethiopia and Somalia.
- 3. A further point is that we do not want to obtain excessive or favourable publicity in the Third World for the PCI by disseminating its statements; the vague aspirations to "peace" and "Socialism" which they contain are just the sort of thing likely to evoke what for us would be an undesirable response in developing countries. As you noted in your letter of 28 January, it would be wrong for us to do the PCI's work for it by seeming to defend its democratic credentials.
- 4. We have just finished the draft of a Background Brief on "The Soviet Union and Western Communist Parties" (we eschew the word "Eurocommunism") in which the PCI has the lion's share; it takes the story as far as the Gus Hall speech which Pravda reproduced at length on 10 March. When we say that the PCI "remains part of the world Communist movement" we mean that, as Zagladin said in his Paese Sera interview on 8 February, there has been no final breach as there was with Yugoslavia in 1948 or China in 1960.
- 5. Our Background Brief format is not long enough for us to discuss fully what the "world Communist movement" amounts to in practice; this would be an interesting subject for a major study. We have however included some Eastern European reactions in the paper, though they are, except the Romanian, simply Soviet gramophone records. Space precluded an adequate treatment of the Yugoslav attitude, which in any case we are not particularly keen to highlight.
