- 1. CONFIDENTIAL ENTIRE TEXT.
- 2. THE VISITS HERE NEXT WEEK OF THE VICE PRESIDENT AND SECRETARY OF DEFENSE PROVIDE THE FIRST OPPORTUNITY SINCE THE BRITISH ELECTIONS TO PROJECT ANEW U.S. VIEWS AND POLICIES. WE EXPECT CONSIDERABLE INTEREST FROM THE MEDIA, WHICH MAY LOOK FOR ANGLES BEYOND THE EDU/IDU CONFERENCE AND SECDEF'S PILGRIMS SPEECH. HERE'S OUR SENSE OF THE ATMOSPHERICS ON SECURITY.
- 3. THE POLITICAL SCENE HERE IS MUCH CHANGED SINCE THE VICE PRESIDENT'S VISIT IN FEBRUARY. THEN, THE "PEACE" MOVEMENT WAS AT ITS HEIGHT AND THOSE AROUND THE PM WERE WORRIED ABOUT THE POLITICAL CONSEQUENCES OF INF DEPLOYMENT. MRS. THATCHER WAS ENTERING A CRUCIAL PHASE OF HER LEADERSHIP IN THE KNOWLEDGE THAT NO TORY PRIME MINISTER HAD BEEN ACCORDED SUCCESSIVE ELECTORAL MANDATES IN THIS CENTURY. CONFIDENTIAL
