THE VICE PRESIDENT DISCUSSED WITH FOREIGN SECRETARY HOWE AT THE FOREIGN OFFICE JUNE 24 EAST-WEST RELATIONS, AFGHANISTAN, POLAND, CENTRAL AMERICA, THE MIDDLE EAST, HONK KONG, THE AIRLINES ANTI-TRUST CASE, AND THE U.S. ECONOMY. OTHER BRITISH PARTICIPANTS WERE FOREIGN OFFICE POLITICAL DIRECTOR SIR JULIAN BULLARD, ASSISTANT UNDER ECRETARIES SIR JOHN LEAHY AND JOHN URE, AND ECONOMIC RELATIONS DEPARTMENT HEAD LEN APPLEYAR. OTHER U.S. PARTICIPANTS WERE AMBASSADOR LOUIS, ADMIRAL MURPHY, ASSISTANT SECRETARY RICHARD BURT, ASSISTANT TO THE VICE PRESIDENT FOR NATIONAL SECURITY DONALD GREGG, DEPUTY ASSISTANT TO THE PRESIDENT FOR NATIONAL SECURITY AFFAIRS CHARLES TYSON, AND A/DCM RICHARD MCCORMACK.
- 3. OPENING REMARKS: THE VICE PRESIDENT SAID HE WAS UP-BEAT ON THE U.S. ECONOMY, WHICH WAS RECOVERING EVEN MORE STRONGLY THAN SOME EXPECTED AND CONTRIBUTING TO A GENERAL FEELING OF OPTIMISM ABOUT THE FUTURE. THE REAPPOINMENT SECRET

CONCERNS ABOT THE MIDDLE EAST. HABIB WOULD BE RETURNING TO THE AREA SHORTLY. IN CENTRAL AMERICA WE WERE DOING WHAT WAS IN OUR INTEREST AND IN THE INTEREST OF OTHER COUNTRIES CONCERNED WITH PROMOTIG DEMOCRACY. WE WERE AWARE OF THE EMOTION ON THIS ISSUE, AND NEEDED TO DO A BETTER JOB IN TELLING OUR STORY. IN THE PACIFIC, OUR RELATIONS WERE BASICALLY GOOD, EXCEPT FOR VIETNAM. WITH CHINA OUR TIES WERE BETTER THAN THE PRESS IMPLIED. IN EAST-WEST RELATIONS, SOME THINK THE PRESIDENT IS TOO HARD-LINE, BUT HE IS NOT. CENTRAL AMERICA: NOTING THAT THREE-QUARTERS OF OUR ASSISTANCE TO THE AREA IS ECONOMIC AID, THE VICE PRESIDENT SAID WE HAD TO DO A BETTER JOB IN EXPLAINING OUR EFFORTS TO FOSTER DEMOCRACY AND ECONOMIC REFORM.
