Before leaving London I wish to send you my best cordial farewell, remembering our friendly and precious collaboration when I was Prime Minister and Foreign Minister ad interim of my Country, and especially during the Italian Presidency of the European Council in Luxembourg and Venice as well as during the Italian Presidency of the Summit of the Seven most industrialised Countries in Venice. I also have very good memories of our meetings in London and Rome in a difficult and delicate moment for the NATO and EEC Countries. I was then particularly glad to see that we were able to confirm and strengthen the already very good relations traditionally existing between our two Countries, in a climate of a mutual trust, esteem and, if you allow me, of sincere personal admiration. I have met in Westminster, in a courtesy call, Lord Hailsham of Marylebone, Lord Chancellor, member of your Cabinet, in his capacity of Speaker of the House of Lords. Prime Minister, who gave his strong, courageous and friendly support to the foreign policy of the two Governments I presided. These are the wishes I may express as Senator and European citizen, even in my new capacity as President of the Senate being obliged to impartiality (my position being different to that of the Lord Chancellor!).

I am happy that will probably be in London this month also the Italian Minister for Foreign Affairs my dear friend the Hon. Giulio Andreotti whom you have met as a colleague when he was President of the Italian Government.

I have learnt now of your eye desease and I wish to express you my best wishes for your prompt recovery.
