Congratulations to you on your appointment as Chairman of the United Nations Committee for Development Planning. I can assure you that the questions you raise - such as debt, the functioning of the international monetary system and the problems of the poorest countries - will be very much on our minds at the London Economic Summit. We shall be briefing Commonwealth representatives in London on the results of the Summit. One small practical point: our recollection of the outcome of discussion at the Commonwealth Consultative Group was that the conclusions were slightly less clear-cut than the enclosure to your letter of 24 May indicates.
