PRIME MINISTER

President Pertini of Italy has sent you the attached manuscript note, written as he was passing through London earlier today on his way to Oxford to receive an honorary degree. It reads as follows:

"I am passing through London on my way to Oxford to receive an honorary degree from that ancient and prestigious university. I shall not be coming to see you, much as I would have liked to, because I do not want to disturb your most important work. But I would like to send you my affectionate regards and warm best wishes for your work which, my dear friend, is in the interests of the great British people and of peace in the world.

With great sympathy and affection.

Sandro Pertini."

We did in fact offer to arrange a meeting with you, and indeed lunch, but he declined this on grounds of lack of time. You may like to reply briefly and in manuscript. I attach some paper. I suggest something on the lines of:

"Dear President Pertini,

I was delighted to receive your charming note and share your regret that it was not possible for us to meet on this occasion. I have always enjoyed our talks and found them fascinating. The honorary degree is only a small recognition of the immense contribution which you have made to the life of Italy and of Europe over the years and to world peace.
