(b) Meeting of the GAC: the "Real Lives" Controversy
(336 (c))

The Secretary said that a meeting of the GAC Steering Committee, on 9th October, had sensibly addressed the question, raised earlier by Council members, of provision for discussion of the "Real Lives"

controversy. Lord Caldecote had identified the issues and placed them in their present context. The GAC meeting on 30th October was likely to take its normal form. The principle subject for discussion would be the BBC's evidence to the Peacock Committee. The Chairman said that Lord Caldecote had agreed to continue in office for the October meeting. A successor, however, would have to be appointed shortly and he invited Governors to suggest possible candidates.
