BUT WEINBERGER, SPEAKING AT A PRESS CLUB MEETING IN CANBERRA, AUSTRALIA, WOULD ONLY TELL REPORTERS, "I OBVIOUSLY CANT GO INTO DISCUSSIONS THAT WOULD INDICATE WHETHER THE ANSWER WAS YES OR NO, OR MAYBE" TO QUESTIONS ABOUT A POSSIBLE MILITARY STRIKE. ABC SAID THE UNITED STATES WAS CONDUCTING ANOTHER ROUND OF CONSULTATIONS WITH ITS EUROPEAN ALLIES AND PROMISED TO "RETALIATE QUICKLY WITHOUT NOTICE" THE NEXT TIME A KHADAFY-ORDERED TERRORIST ATTACK OCCURS. IN LONDON, THE DAILY MAIL REPORTED REAGAN HAS ASKED PRIME MINISTER MARGARET THATCHER TO ALLOW HIM TO STRIKE AT LIBYA USING AMERICAN F-111 JETS BASED IN BRITAIN. SOME 150 U.S. F-111 JETS ARE BASED IN BRITAIN. THE PRIME MINISTERS OFFICE REFUSED TO COMMENT ON WHAT IT CALLED "PURELY SPECULATIVE" REPORTS. UPI 04-11-86 07:24 PES
