Jean Denton rang me this morning from Switzerland.

She said that the Evening Standard seemed to be aware that the Prime Minister would be "accepting" a Rover 800 on 10 July. I said that I was not particularly concerned that they had advance knowledge of the fact that a Rover was coming to Downing Street, though it should be made quite clear to them that the Prime Minister was not accepting a car as a gift, but simply trying it out or demonstrating it. Jean Denton apparently took the point. I subsequently spoke to Jim Coe and Nick Towers in Press Office who relayed a similar message to the Standard when they rang about the story. (Despite these efforts the Standard's story was thoroughly misleading.)

Miss Denton also informed me that the Rover would be brought to Chequers on a trailer behind a Range Rover, and would be accompanied by Mr. Ray Axe (Chief Designer) and Mr. Derek Peck (Director in charge of the project). She will let us have the registration number of the Range Rover in due course.
