As you know, Mrs. Thatcher has asked to meet with the President in mid-November. Her original request was made in anticipation of a Gorbachev Summit in late November, i.e., before we announced the Reykjavik meeting.

Nonetheless, she clearly continues to want to come in mid-November -- hopefully to Camp David on Saturday, November 15. The British Embassy confirmed this in a meeting with me today. Price has also sent a message and called the President. Your note on the President's readout of Price's call indicated that the President and Don Regan have agreed in principle to the meeting (Tab II).

State supports the meeting, particularly since it is not coming out of their normal monthly quota. For my part, I question whether we should push for a session at Camp David on Saturday, November 15. I had hoped that we could arrange a meeting on Friday, November 14 and avoid disrupting the President's weekend; but, I understand from Rod McDaniel that a definite decision has been made to meet at Camp David.

As an aside, I wish to note that should we invite Allied leaders to Washington for a consultation meeting -- assuming a Washington Summit later this year -- we may have to adjust the invitation to Mrs. Thatcher.

Nevertheless, we could meet on Friday, November 14 and avoid disrupting the President's weekend. It is my impression that we avoid weekend Presidential meetings when we can, and I see no compelling reason to go to Camp David -- other than that is what Mrs. Thatcher hopes to do. They could have a small meeting in Washington thereby creating the sense of "intimacy" that Mrs. Thatcher desires.

There is the further complication of not knowing when the President and Gorbachev will meet again following Reykjavik, and how we would handle overall Allied consultations for such a meeting. But I think we need to send forward the Schedule Proposal now and adjust later, if a second meeting with Gorbachev requires us to do so.

As you know, Mrs. Thatcher has asked to meet with the President in mid-November. The President's note (Tab A) on Charlie Price's call indicates that he is willing to meet with her. A meeting would be helpful in advancing Alliance solidarity on East-West issues.

While Mrs. Thatcher has stated a preference to meet at Camp David on Saturday, November 15, I see no compelling reason, from our point of view, to interrupt the President's weekend schedule. Between now and Christmas will be an especially demanding period for him.

The Schedule Proposal that my office is sending Fred Ryan will recommend a meeting and working lunch on Friday, November 14. We should keep the number of participants small to convey the "intimacy" that Mrs. Thatcher seems to prefer. Our informal information indicates that Mrs. Thatcher could come on November 14; however, if she complains too loudly we could reconsider Camp David on Saturday, November 15.
