At the last meeting of the 1922 Committee, Christopher Murphy, (Welwyn and Hatfield) made a strong attack on the attitude of Central Office in general and on Frank Marshall in particular about their alleged defeatist attitude towards the forthcoming County Council Elections.

In a note to me afterwards, he wrote as follows:"Can I emphasise to you (and therefore to the Prime
Minister) that the "smell of defeat" sensed by Lord
Marshall et al is doing Tory morale no good at all.
We must provide leadership and firm resolve to
encourage our candidates and troops, and I trust
MPs will, even if Central Office will not. The
Opposition is divided and although clearly we
cannot do well, a sense of confidence can stop the
worst defeats".
