6 SELECTION AND ADOPTION OF PROSPECTIVE PARLIAMENTARY CANDIDATE

Mr Howard Flight has been selected and will be adopted for the by-election only on Tuesday 15th December. Mr Flight fought the seat in February and October 1974.

7 THE ASSOCIATION

Bermondsey Conservative Association is virtually non-existent as an organisation and as a campaigning unit. The 'paper' membership is under 100 and the activists number about eight at the most.

The Association, such as it is, has been kept going by Mrs Ruby Hayward MBE as Hon Secretary and as election agent in many elections. She is now well over 60 and has been seriously ill for the past two years. Her husband, Charles, is the Association Chairman but he too is over 60 and anxious to retire from active politics.

Both will help as much as they can in the By-election, although Mrs Hayward may well be difficult.

In addition to the Haywards, there are four of five other members who will give limited assistance.

It must be clearly understood that any work which has to be done between now and the calling of the By-election can only be done by bringing in help from outside - and that goes for the By-election campaign itself.

8 THE AGENT

Eighteen months ago, we caused the three Constituency Associations within the Borough to come together and appoint a Borough Agent - that is Dulwich, Peckham and Bermondsey. With the aid of a grant from the Central Office, an Agent was appointed - Miss Rose Freeman. She appears to have settled in reasonably well, although she lacks experience. It must also be said that she has had to devote herself largely to the marginal seat of Dulwich. She will need constant support and guidance in the By-election.

9 HEADQUARTERS

There is no Constituency office. The correspondance address is Mr and Mrs Haywards' flat in a tower block.

Howard Flight is seeking suitable accommodation from which we could fight the By-election, and the whole campaign will be managed from one headquarters. We shall not have any ward committee rooms.

10 FINANCE

The Association has very little money and only limited money raising potential. My Area Chairman will, as usual, make an appeal to the other 91 constituency Associations in London. (At Croydon North West, this raised just over £1,000) With a legal maximum of approximately £2,300, there will be a considerable shortfall.

11 MUTUAL AID

Almost the whole of the deliveries of literature, survey canvass, election canvassing etc. will have to be undertaken by mutual aid from other constituencies. I shall have my Deputy Chairman - Mrs C A Prendergast and one of my Vice Chairmen - Leslie Caldwell to organise this.

Two serious problems will have to be overcome. The first is that a large part of the Bermondsey constituency is in the dockland area of London where muggings, hooliganism and vandalism are rife; canvas ing and delivery will have to be done by teams rather than by ones and twos, and wherever possible, we must aim to do deliveries in daylight. There is no point in underestimating this problem.

The other problem is that on 6th May 1982, vitally important elections take place in all of the 32 London Boroughs. Even the so called safe Conservative Boroughs are very nervous about these elections and if the by-election is called later than early March, we shall be faced with considerable reluctance of constituencies to send mutual aid teams to Bermondsey, which they will see as a lost cause.

12 . PRE-BY-ELECTION LEAFLETTING

We are now in the course of producing an 'In Touch' newsletter which will be Southwark based, in that it will be a 'lead in' to the Borough elections. We are featuring in the newsletter the iniquities of Southwark's Labour Council, some Government good news and a feature about Howard Flight's adoption. Delivery of this newsletter will take place the first week in January and the subsequent editions will be produced every fortnight.

I have assembled a production team and the job will be finished at the end of this week (18th December).

13 SURVEY CANVASS

We intend to mount a Survey Canvass - probably on the basis of one in every 100 electors, (About 500 interviews) at the end of January.
