1. CONFIDENTIAL ENTIRE TEXT.

2. SUMMARY: FOLLOWING THE U.S. AIR STRIKES ON LIBYA, MORNING RADIO AND TV IN BRITAIN PREDICTABLY FEATURED INTERVIEWS WITH LEADING POLITICAL FIGURES -- PRIMARILY FOREIGN SECRETARY HOWE FOR THE GOVERNMENT, DAVID OWEN FOR THE ALLIANCE PARTIES, AND NEIL KINNOCK AND DENIS HEALEY FOR LABOR. HOWE REPEATEDLY AND FORCEFULLY CONFIDENTIAL

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EXPLAINED WHY THE GOVERNMENT AGREED THAT ACTION HAD TO BE TAKEN AND PROMISED THAT THATCHER WOULD MAKE A STATEMENT LATER AT THE HOUSE OF COMMONS. DAVID OWEN, WHILE EXPRESSING DOUBTS ABOUT THE ACTION, SAID IT WAS

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EVIDENCE, AS PRESIDENT KENNEDY HAD DONE IN THE CASE OF THE CUBAN MISSILE CRISIS. A SOBER LABOR PARTY LEADER NEIL KINNOCK SAID THAT THE F-111S ARE IN BRITAIN FOR NATO PURPOSES AND THAT LABOR WOULD NOT HAVE LET THEM BE USED IN THIS WAY. HE ALSO STRESSED THAT THE U.S.

IN THE DAYS AHEAD. END SUMMARY

3. THE CABINET MET THIS MORNING IN EMERGENCY SESSION IN PREPARATION FOR A STATEMENT BY MRS. THATCHER TO THE HOUSE OF COMMONS IN THE AFTERNOON. NUMBER 10 IS APPARENTLY WITHHOLDING ANY COMMENTS UNTIL THAT TIME, BUT THE CABINET IS REPORTED TO HAVE OFFERED ITS FULL SUPPORT. FOREIGN SECRETARY HOWE HAS APPEARED REPEATEDLY ON TELEVISION AND RADIO INTERVIEWS IN DEFENSE OF THE U.S. ACTION AND HMG'S DECISION TO PERMIT THE U.S. TO FLY BOMBERS FROM BASES IN THE UK. IN HIS COMMENTS, HOWE HAS STRESSED THE RIGHT OF SELF DEFENSE UNDER ARTICLE 51 AND HAS ARGUED THAT THE AMERICAN CONFIDENTIAL

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ACTION HAD BECOME "NOT MERELY JUSTIFIABLE, BUT SPEAKING ON BBC RADIO, THE FOREIGN ESSENTIAL." SECRETARY ASKED: "ARE WE TO STAND BY AND ALLOW TERRORISM DIRECTED BY LIBYAN AUTHORITIES TO CONTINUE ABSOLUTELY UNCHECKED WHEN THEY HAVE BEEN APPEALED TO BY PEACEFUL MEANS THROUGH THE UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL; WHEN WE HAVE GOT CLEAR EVIDENCE OF FURTHER INTENDED PLANS OF SIMILAR TERRORISTS ACTS? IN THOSE CIRCUMSTANCES SOME ACTION BECOMES NOT MERELY JUSTIFIBLE BUT ESSENTIAL." HOWE NOTED THAT DIFFERENT COUNTRIES REACTED IN DIFFERENT WAYS ACCORDING TO THE SCALE OF SUFFERING THEY THEMSELVES HAD EXPERIENCED, AND SAID THAT "IN FACE OF THAT AND IN FACE OF EQUALLY INCONTROVERTIBLE EVIDENCE OF FURTHER PLANS OF ACTION OF THAT KIND, OUR CAREFULLY CONSIDERED REACTION WAS CLEAR."

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4. LABOR PARTY LEADER NEIL KINNOCK ATTACKED THE AMERICAN ACTION, SAYING "THIS WILL PROVOKE RATHER THAN PREVENT TERRORISM, AND IT WILL GIVE QADHAFI MORE SUPPORTERS AND ALLIES IN THE MIDDLE EAST THAN THIS TIME LAST WEEK." HE ADMITTED THAT BRITAIN AND OTHER EUROPEAN NATIONS SHOULD HAVE TAKEN ACTION TO TIGHTEN SECURITY AND TO ISOLATE LIBYA, BUT ADDED THAT "PRESIDENT REAGAN HAS NO RIGHT, WHATEVER THE RESPONSE OF THE EUROPEAN ALLIES, TO PUSH THEM FROM THE BACK TO SECURE A POSITION FROM THE EUROPEAN POWERS THAT THEY ARE NOT WILLING SPONTANEOUSLY TO ADOPT THEMSELVES." HE CALLED THE USE OF AMERICAN BASES IN BRITAIN A "MISUSE OF NATO FORCES" AND ADDED THAT THE PRIME MINISTER'S COATTAIL ATTITUDE HELPS NEITHER THE U.S. NOR THE UK. SDP LEADER DAVID OWEN, BEING INTERVIEWED ON BBC, NOTED THAT THE END IS ONE EVERYONE SHARES BUT (DESPITE THE DETAILED NATURE OF THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS TO THE NATION THE PREVIOUS EVENING) PLACED HEAVY EMPHASIS ON THE NEED FOR PRECISE EVIDENCE.
