## LEGISLATIVE PROGRAMME 1985/86

I was most surprised to receive your letter of 28 May. I must resist most strongly the suggestion that the Wages Bill should be deleted from the programme for the next session.

I published a Consultative Paper in March setting out the alternatives of either abolition or reform of Wages Councils. Nigel specifically referred to it in his Budget speech, and the setting of a short period (now concluded), for consultation, was on the clear basis that we proposed early action. It is on this understanding that I shall be putting proposals to colleagues shortly.

This is an issue of considerable interest on our backbenches, we have emphasised the contribution that could be made to more employment by action in this area, and it would therefore not be credible if there were no place available in the 85/86 programme.

I am copying this letter to the Prime Minister and Cabinet colleagues.
