PRIME MINISTER LEGISLATIVE PROGRAMME NEXT SESSION It will be difficult to refer to some of the bills in next year's programme which have not yet been announced without falling foul of the general rule that we do not anticipate The Queen's Speech but major Government legislation next session which has already been presaged includes:the legislation to give effect to Norman Fowler's far reaching review of social security the legislation to privatise British Gas that to implement Tom King's announcement on Wages Councils the most extensive revision to public order legislation since the Public Order Act 1936 which will also take forward the Government's plans for dealing with football hooliganism the bill to take forward Nicholas Ridley's plans for privsatising British airports. Other subjects on which legislation is in the programme but which have not yet been announced include Royal Dockyards on which Michael Heseltine is due to make a statement next week and local government practices, on which outcome of Widdicombe is waited.
