Possible call by Sir J Bullard on the Prime Minister

Sir Julian Bullard, HM Ambassador in Bonn, has asked whether he might see the Prime Minister in the course of his leave. An appointment on 25 July, 26 July, 5 August or 9 August would fit in best with his programme, though we could look at other times before 9 August if these are impractical.

Sir Geoffrey Howe recommends that the Prime Minister should see Sir Julian Bullard if her programme would allow this. Close and systematic Anglo-German cooperation will be vital to success at Luxembourg and at the intergovernmental conference. Sir Julian Bullard has established a sound personal relationship with Chancellor Kohl - who saw him yesterday alone.

The situation in Germany is fluid, not to say confused. Sir Geoffrey Howe thinks the Prime Minister might find it valuable to have the Ambassador's personal assessment of likely developments.
