The Hungarians have expressed considerable disappointment that there will be only one hour for talks, given that the Prime Minister's talks with Mr Kadar in Budapest lasted 2½ hours. They have stressed that he wishes to have a thorough exchange of views and regards their talks as the real purpose for coming to London. I should be grateful to know whether it would be possible to extend the talks to two hours (in effect one hour with interpretation). The ideal timing would be to start the talks at 1600 or before, allowing time for Mr Kadar to return to his hotel to rest before dinner.
