I refer to your letter of 8 November. You kindly agreed to extend the deadline for the DTI's submissions. I now enclose (a) a list of this Department's bids; (b) eight pro-formas. There are six bids for Bills in 1986/87 and one for a Bill in 1987/88. One of the seven (Statistics of Trade Amendment) is put forward as a Government Bill in 1986/87 or failing that in 1987/88, with a request that if it cannot be accommodated as a Government Bill in 1986/87 it be given to a Private Member for that session. Accordingly, there is both an "Annex A" and "Annex B" bid for this Bill. You will see that we are bidding for only two major programme Bills in 1986/87, one of which (Copyright and Other Intellectual Property) already has an advance place. The other (Consumer Goods and Services) narrowly missed selection last year for 1985/86 and in DTI Ministers' view must now be a contender with very high priority. Should the Companies (Audit) Bill for any reason not be proceeded with in 1986/87, there will be a bid next year for major Companies legislation in 1987/88 and DTI Ministers hope that this will be given favourable consideration in next year's round.
