ANGLO/SOVHET RELATIONS : ARMS CONTROL

1. WAS SUMMONED BY DEPUTY FOREIGN MINISTER RYZHOV THIS
MORNING 7 FEBRUARY. READING FROM A PREPARED STATEMENT WHICH HE
DID NOT HAND OVER HE SAID THAT THE SOVIET AUTHORITIES HAD NOT
FAILED TO NOTICE THE IMPORTANCE ATTACHED BY THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT
TO THE ABM TREATY AND OUR VIEW THAT OBSERVANCE WAS FUNDAMENTAL TO
THE STRATEGIC ARMS LIMITATION PROCESS. HOWEVER, BRITISH DEEDS
DID NOT MATCH BRITISH WORDS IN TWO AREAS: SDI PARTICIPATION AND
THE FYLINGDALES RADAR STATION.

2. ON FYLINGDALES, HE RECALLED THE STATEMENTS OF THE BRITTISH SIDE. DURING HIS TALKS IN LONDON, THAT FYLINGDALES WAS AN EARLY WARNING STATION WHICH HAD EXISTED BEFORE THE ABM TREATY AND WHICH WAS NOW BEING MODERNISED AS THE TREATY PERMITTED. HOWEVER, THE FACTS SHOWED OTHERWISE. THE "PAY-PAWS" STATION (AND HE REPEATED SUBSEQUENTLY THAT IN THE SOVIET VIEW THE NEW FYLINGDALES WOULD BE AN ENTIRELY NEW INSTALLATION) WITH A POWER OF 3 MILLION WATTS PER SQUARE METRE CLEARLY CONTRADICTED THE STATEMENT OF 26 MAY 1972 DEFINING CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH PHASED ARRAY WAS PERMITTED. IN ADDITION ARTICLE VII(B) OF THE ABM TREATY CONTAINED A SPECIFIC PROVISION ON THE DEPLOYMENT OF RADARS FOR DETECTION OF STRATEGIC BALLISTIC MISSILE ATTACK ONLY ON THE PERIPHERY OF THE TERRITORY CONCERNED AND ORIENTED OUTWARD. IMPLEMENTATION OF PLANS TO CONSTRUCT THE NEW RADAR STATION AT FYLINGDALES WHICH WAS CLEARLY NOT ON U.S. TERRITORY WAS THEREFORE A DIRECT VIOLATION OF THE ABM TREATY. WESTERN EXPERTS (UN-NAMED) SHARED THIS VIEW. RYZHOV HOPED THESE POINTS WOULD BE CONSIDERED WITH ALL SERIOUSNESS BY HMG AND THAT WE WOULD ''DRAW THE NECESSARY CONCLUSIONS''.

3. IN UNDERTOOK TO REPORT RYZHOV'S STATEMENT AND MADE THE FOLLOWING POINTS:

- POSHTION ON THIS WAS WELL KNOWN AND HAD NOT CHANGED. IL
- WARNING STATION ALREADY IN EXISTENCE AT THE TIME OF THE ABM
 TREATY AND THATS LITS MODERNISATION DID NOT VIOLATE THE
 TREATY.

- HAND HANG REMAINED FIRMLY COMMITTED TO THE ABM TREATY. I HOPED THAT NO-ONE WOULD BELIEVE THAT HAG'S ATTITUDE TO THE ABM TREATY WAS SUCH AS WOULD ALLOW HIT ON THE ONE HAND TO SUPPORT HT PUBLICLY, AND YET EQUALLY PUBLICLY TO PERMIT OR HISELF CARRY OUT ACTIVITIES IN THE U.K. WHICH WERE IN CLEAR BREACH. WE WERE TOTALLY CONFIDENT THAT THE MODERNIZATION BEING CARRIED OUT WAS FULLY PERMITTED.
- QUESTIONS COULD AND SHOULD BE COVERED WHEN THE BILATERAL ARMS
 CONTROL TALKS TOOK PLACE. WE WANTED THESE TO BE WIDE RANGING
 AND COVER ALL ASPECTS, AS NECESSARY BOTH WHITH KARPOV AND
 PETROVSKY. THESE TALKS WOULD BE A USEFUL PREPARATION FOR
 YOUR TALKS WITH SHEVARDNADZE IN THE SPRING.

4. RYZHOV SAND THAT NO AMOUNT, OF CONSULTATIONS WOULD CHANGE THE FYLHNGDALES FACTS. HOWEVER HE ADDED THAT THE SOVIET SINDE WANTED FREQUENT CONSULTATIONS WHICH SHOULD NOT TAKE THE FORM OF OPPOSING MONOLOGUES, BUT SEEK CONVERGENCE OF VIEWS. THE SOVIET SINDE DID NOT LIKE CONSULTATIONS WHICH BROUGHT NO RESULTS. PREPARATIONS FOR TALKS AT FOREIGN MINISTER LEVEL HAD STARTED. HT WAS IMPORTANT THAT BRITAIN WHICH BEFORE THE SUMMIT HAD SUPPORTED US/SOVIET EFFORTS TO REACH AGREEMENTS WHICH WOULD REDUCE TENSION, SHOULD NOW METICULOUSLY REFRAIN FROM ANY ACTION WHICH MIGHT HINDER PROGRESS.

COMMENT

THE MINISTRY REFUSED TO GIVE ADVANCE NOTICE OF THE TOPIC. NO SOVIET ARMS CONTROL OFFICIALS WERE PRESENT. RYZHOV DID NOT ASK FOR A REPLY, MERELY FOR US TO DRAW THE RIGHT CONCLUSIONS. THERE WAS NO APPARENT URGENCY REQUIRING THIS APPROACH DURING THE TWO WORKING DAYS OF THE AMBASSADOR'S ABSENCE FROM MOSCOW. THE RUSSIANS HAVE CRITIZED FYLINGDALES BEFORE. IF CONCLUDE THAT THIS WAS A PRO-FORMA EXERCISE.
