PRIME MINISTER

SAINSBURY GROUP MEETING: 30 APRIL

You have a half hour briefing meeting at 0900 hours with the Secretary of State for the Environment, the Secretary of State for Employment, Lord Elton (Environment) and Michael Howard (DTI).

The Secretary of State for the Environment has provided a note summarising the current position on the key items discussed at the previous meeting on 10 December (Flag B. There is a more detailed annex at Flag C, which you do not need to read). Lord Young's note at Flag D notes the possibility of including a reference to the abolition of structure plans in his proposed May White Paper on deregulation. The note you have already seen from Hartley Booth is at Flag A.

The key points for discussion at the meeting, and at the briefing, are:

- (i) the time taken to reach decisions on appeal (the DOE's figures, you will remember, seem to have been carefully chosen to show how the situation is improving but figures supplied to Hartley, through Sir John Sainsbury, suggest (Flag E) that the position on many types of appeal have got worse since 1979).
- (ii) Structure plans. The Secretary of State is proposing their abolition, but wants the Sainsbury Group wound up, in its current form, apparantly as a quid pro quo.

There is to be a Ministerial pre-meeting at 0900. We have allocated an hour and a half in our diary for the meeting proper. I expect that the meeting will follow the same pattern as its predecessors.
