## PRIME MINISTER

## ARMS CONTROL

We have only limited time for this meeting. But there is another session next week to prepare for the Camp David meeting.

I suggest you deal first with the <u>conventional arms control in Europe</u> issue. This is operational in the sense that the Foreign Secretary leaves for Vienna later this afternoon, and needs some instructions.

On the <u>preparations</u> for <u>Camp David</u> you commented this morning that we hadn't yet thought things through enough. I think the line proposed in my minute takes matters some way forward. An outcome from today's meeting might be:

- (i) to let FCO/MOD have what I have done, to work up into a fuller speaking note;
- (ii) at the same time ask them to produce material to deal with the important points which their present paper does not cover e.g. the proposal made by Reagan to Kohl for a high level discussion with key allies, the idea that non-ballistic systems offer sufficient deterrence, the idea of SDI as a sufficient insurance policy.
