SECRETARY OF STATE'S BILATERAL WITH SHULTZ: ARMS CONTROL
SUMMARY

1. DISCUSSION OF THE FORUM FOR TALKS ON CONVENTIONAL WEAPONS. SHULTZ TO STUDY OUR "IDEAS AND DISCUSS WITH FRENCH. SECRETARY OF STATE EMPHASISES DIFFICULTY FOR UK OF ELIMINATION OF BALLISTIC NUCLEAR WEAPONS WITHOUT CORRESPONDING REGULATION OF CONVENTIONAL FORCES. SHULTZ PRODUCES SOME RAW IDEAS ON DETERRENCE WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF ELIMINATION OF BALLISTIC MISSILES.

2. THE SECRETARY OF STATE HAD A 40 MINUTE MEETING WITH SHULTZ THIS MORNING. THIS TELEGRAM COVERS ARMS CONTROL MATTERS. MIFT COVERS OTHER SUBJECTS.

## CONVENTIONAL WEAPONS

- 3. THE SECRETARY OF STATE SAID THAT WE HAD DISTILLED A SET OF PRINCIPLES WHICH MIGHT BE HELPFUL IN RECONCILING US AND FRENCH DIFFERENCES OVER THE FORUM IN WHICH CONVENTIONAL ARMS SHOULD BE DISCUSSED. HE HANDED A COPY OF THE PRINCIPLES TO SHULTZ. HE EXPLAINED THAT THEY HAD BEEN WORKED OUT WITH THE GERMANS, AND THAT HE HAD ALREADY GIVEN A COPY TO M. RAIMOND, WHOM HE UNDERSTOOD THAT SHULTZ WOULD BE SEEING IN PARIS ON FRIDAY.
- 4. SHULTZ SAID THAT HE UNDERSTOOD THAT M. RAIMOND HAD MADE A SPEECH IN VIENNA WHICH WENT VERY HARD ON THE FRENCH POSITION AND PROBABLY VIOLATED THE PRINCIPLES WE WERE SUGGESTING. HE WAS WONDERING WHETHER THERE WAS ANY POINT GOING TO PARIS AT ALL. MS RIDGEWAY SAID THAT SHE THOUGHT THE SPEECH STILL LEFT SOME CHINKS OF LIGHT. SHULTZ ASKED WHETHER THE FRENCH COULD BUY THE PRINCIPLES WE WERE SUGGESTING. THE SECRETARY OF STATE SAID THAT HE COULD NOT GUARANTEE THAT THEY WOULD, BUT THAT WE HOPED THEY WOULD BE A BASIS FOR DISCUSSION. SHULTZ SAID THAT HE WOULD DISCUSS THEM WITH RAIMOND IN PARIS, BUT THAT HE DID NOT INTEND TO PUSH FOR RECONCILHATION OF HE JUDGED THE FRENCH WERE NOT READY FOR OIT. HE WONDERED WHETHER THE PRIME MINISTER WOULD BRING ANY FURTHER IDEAS WITH HER TO WASHINGTON. THE SECRETARY OF STATE SAID THAT THE PRINCIPLES HE HAD JUST HANDED OVER REPRESENTED OUR BEST EFFORT. SHULTZ SAID THAT HE COULD NOT GIVE MALTA CONTROL OVER US FORCES. THE SECRETARY OF STATE SYMPATHISED.

## NUCLEAR ARMS REDUCTIONS

5. THE SECRETARY OF STATE SAID THAT IN HIS BILATERAL MEETING,
SHEVARDNADZE HAD REAFFIRMED THE LINKAGE BETWEEN SDI AND OTHER AREAS:
THE SECRETARY OF STATE HAD CHALLENGED IT. HE WAS GRATEFUL FOR
SHULTZ'S LETTER. HOWEVER HE HAD TO STRESS AGAIN THE ESSENTIAL LINK
WHICH WE SAW PETWEEN THE SECOND STAGE OF THE PROPOSED REDUCTION OF
STRATEGIC BALLISTIC WEAPONS AND AGREEMENT ON CONVENTIONAL WEAPONS.

THE PRIME MINISTER WOULD BE RAISING THIS IN WASHINGTON WITH THE PRESIDENT. THERE WERE A SERIES OF RIPPLE EFFECTS OF WHAT THE AMERICANS WERE CONTEMPLATING:

- UNDERCUTTING THE CREDIBILITY OF THE WEST'S DETERRENT POSTURE BOTH AT HOME AND WITH THE RUSSIANS.
- (III) SHULTZ HAD ARGUED THAT WINDING UP THE DETERRENT COMPONENT IN ALLIANCE STRATEGY SHOULD LEAD TO GREATER EMPHASIS ON PROVISION OF CONVENTIONAL FORCES. IT COULD EASILY LEAD TO FINLANDISATION. IF HIT WAS ARGUED THAT CONVENTIONAL BALANCE MUST BE SOUGHT CONCURRENTLY WITH THE ELIMINATION OF BALLISTIC WEAPONS, HIT WAS ECONOMICALLY AND POLITICALLY UNLIKELY THAT THIS COULD BE ACHIEVED ON THE BASIS OF INCREASED EXPENDITURE ON CONVENTIONAL WEAPONS.
- STAGE OF THE REDUCTION OF STRATEGIC WEAPONS COULD BE AND WERE BEING DEPLOYED IN THE UK AGAINST THE TRIDENT PROGRAMME. THE PRIME MINISTER HAD BEEN CHALLENGED ON THIS IN THE HOUSE LAST WEEK. THE RUSSIANS WERE PORTRAYING ALL THE ELEMENTS ON WHICH THERE HAD BEEN DISCUSSION AT REYKJAVIK AS THOUGH THEY WERE PART OF AN AGREED ACQUIS. IF THE CASE FOR TRIDENT WAS UNDERCUT IT INCREASED ENORMOUSLY THE PROSPECT OF A CHANGE OF GOVERNMENT IN THE UK AND THEREFORE THE PROSPECT OF A GOVERNMENT WHICH WOULD WISH TO GET RID OF US PASES AS WELL AS NUCLEAR WEAPONS.
- 6. ON THE OTHER HAND WE HAD NO PROBLEMS WITH A 50% CUT IN BALLISTIC WEAPONS OR WITH THE TIME PROPOSALS, PROVIDED THAT SKINE WERE SATISFACTORILY DEALT WITH.
- 7. SHULTZ SAID THAT HE AGREED THAT THE CONCEPT OF DETERRENCE WAS NOT ONE THAT SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO SLIP AWAY: WE COULD NOT ABANDON ONE FORM OF DETERRENCE UNTIL WE HAD ANOTHER. THE BASIC AGGRESIVITY OF THE RUSSIANS WOULD REMAIN.
- WASHINGTON. THE PRESIDENT WAS TALKING OF THE IDEA OF STRATEGIC
  OFFENSIVE WEAPONS AS AN INSURANCE POLICY EVEN IN BALLISTIC WEAPONS
  WERE ELIMINATED. EVEN WITHIN THE CONCEPT OF SUCH ELIMINATION IT WAS
  NOT IMPOSSIBLE TO HAVE SOME BALLISTIC MISSILE INSURANCE POLICY,
  PERHAPS CONSISTING OF LAUNCHERS WITH ONE WAR-HEAD AND A LUMITED
  THROW-WEIGHT. THIS WOULD STILL BE A DETERRENT, BUT A MORE STABLE
  ONE. HE EMPHASISED THAT THIS IDEA HAD NOT BEEN THOUGHT THROUGH.
  BRITISH SYSTEMS COULD BE AN IMPORTANT COMPONENT OF SUCH A DEAL.
  9. HE CONFIRMED THAT THE AMERICANS SAW THEIR DISCUSSIONS WITH THE
  SOVIET UNION AS BILATERAL: IT WOULD BE A MATTER FOR US WHETHER WE
  JOINED IN AT ANY STAGE. HE OBSERVED THAT THE UK MIGHT BE THE ONLY
  POWER LEFT WITH ANY PALLISTIC MISSILES.

10. IT WAS UNLIKELY THAT THE AMERICANS WOULD APQUE IN CENEVA THAT
THE ELIMINATION OF BALLISTIC MISSILES RECUIRED MORE THAN TWO STAGES.
THERE WERE OF COURSE OTHER STRATEGIC WEAPONS BESIDES PALLISTIC
MISSILES. NOR WAS THERE YET AGREEMENT WITH THE SOVIET UNION ON THE
MEANING OF THE TERM BALLISTIC MISSILE, WHICH THE RUSSIANS TOOK TO

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MEAN ONLY STRATEGIC BALLISTIC MISSILES. THERE WERE OTHER TYPES OF BALLISTIC MISSILE.

11. HE PLANNED TO TRY TO SORT OUT SYSTEMATICALLY WITH SHEVARDNADZE IN HIS BILATERALS IN VIENNA THE AREAS OF AGREEMENT AND DISAGREEMENT.

IT WAS OF COURSE POSSIBLE THAT SHEVARDNADZE WOULD ONLY WISH TO TALK ABOUT THE DEFINITION OF LABORATORIES.

12. THE AMERICANS PLANNED TO SAY MORE IN PUBLIC ABOUT THE FACT THAT AT THE MOMENT IT WAS THE NUCLEAR DETERRENT WHICH WAS KEEPING THE PEACE, AND ABOUT THE NEED TO HOLD ONTO THIS. HE COMMENTED THAT THE PROGRESS ON INF SHOWED THE NEED TO HAVE STRENGTH TO DEPLOY ON OUR SIDE IF WE WERE TO BRING THE RUSSIANS TO AGREEMENT.

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
