

CHINA-US: More Critical Propaganda Line

Foreign Minister Huang Hua's public reference to the US as "hegemonist" during the visit of Egyptian Foreign Minister Ali to Beijing last week highlights China's increasing desire to dissociate its policies from those of the US in the Third World. Since the normalization of relations with Washington, Beijing has almost exclusively used the term to criticize Moscow and its clients. Growing Chinese concern with US policy toward Israel and South Africa and with Washington's position on North-South economic issues, however, has prompted Beijing to apply the label to the US several times over the past few months. Chinese frustration over the Taiwan issue also may be a factor. Continued international attention to Third World issues at the UN and during the North-South summit is likely to reinforce this more 25X1 critical line.

USSR: Rise in Retail Prices

The price increases on selected consumer goods that took effect on Tuesday were imposed primarily to absorb excess purchasing power and to take advantage of the strong demand for luxury items. The official price hikes for such merchandise, on which black market profits are very large, ranged from 25 to 30 percent. The leadership is apprehensive about consumer reaction to higher prices because of the Polish situation, and it repeatedly has denied rumors that food prices will go up. It was careful to accompany the announcement of the hikes with decreases in prices for some basic goods. Although the government declared that price increases of 17 to 27 percent for alcohol and tobacco were intended to cut their consumption, which account for a substantial share in Soviet household expenditures, purchasing power among Soviet citizens is now large enough that consumption of these items is unlikely to change.

SOUTH AFRICA: Possible Move Against Black Church Leader

The South African Government may be planning to ban Anglican Bishop Desmond Tutu as part of a crackdown against domestic critics. The Bishop is the secretary general of the South African Council of Churches, a multiracial group representing some 14 million South African Christians. Tutu has gained wide recognition as a black spokesman against apartheid. He criticized the government's recent destruction of squatter towns near Capetown, and the Minister of Police is trying to link him to the African National Congress, the exiled liberation group that recently has carried out a series of bombings in South Africa. A banning order, which would silence the Bishop by placing him under virtual house arrest, could cause a strong reaction at home and abroad--especially if he carries out his threat to defy the order and is jailed.




