She has agreed in general to the terms of the draft announcement enclosed with the Paymaster General's letter of 31 July subject to the addition of the following sentence:-"The Prime Minister has now agreed that this transfer should take place, and that the Industrial Air Pollution Inspectorate should form part of a unified pollution inspectorate." after the first sentence of page 2 of the existing draft. The Prime Minister has, however, asked whether there is not a more impressive name for the new inspectorate and I should be glad if you could give consideration to this comment as soon as possible.
