I have also seen the letter of 1 June from No 10 indicating the Prime Minister's agreement to the paragraph on health risk, subject to her redraft of the final sentence. I agree we should now accept this. I am sorry to have to come back on what is now the sole outstanding point to resolve - the question of water environment protection zones (w.e.p.zs) - and here I must reiterate our view that these should not be referred to within the text of the response. (These are of course a separate issue from water source protection zones, which remain one option for addressing the problem of nitrate in water.) My Department has in recent years mounted a number of initiatives to encourage farmers to conserve the environment by voluntary means: we see a risk that through mentioning w.e.p.zs we could encourage the Green lobby to press for wide-ranging measures on nature protection, thus putting in jeopardy our entire policy of persuasion rather than coercion. I would therefore prefer to see a blander form of words in the text and would suggest in paragraph 1.15 "... undertakers; and re-enactment of the existing provisions of S31(5) of COPA which allow protection zones to be established." I hope you will be able to live with this, particularly as your original draft in any case saw w.e.p.zs being established only on an exceptional basis. /I am copying this ...
