The Defence Secretary is ready to brief colleagues on the deployment of British forces in the area, and the broader strategic implications.

Others who may wish to contribute to the discussion include:

- the Chancellor of the Exchequer (the economic impact of the crisis);
- the Secretary of State for Energy (the impact on energy prices and resources);
- the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry (sanctions implementation);

- the <u>Secretary of State for Transport</u> (shipping and aviation aspects); and
- the <u>Attorney General</u> (the position in international law).

(b) Other issues
