Standing up to the brutal behaviour of the Iraqi authorities, and providing help and reassurance to the British community, present dangers and challenges which I do not underestimate. We have all been heartened by the success of yesterday's convoy of British dependents to Baghdad. Your difficulties will not grow less.
