SAN JOSE MEETHING: NELCARAGUA

1. HIN AN AUDITENCE WHITH PRESHDENT MONGE DURING MEETING, YOU ASKED FOR HIS FRANK VINEWS ON THE NILCARAGUAN PROBLEM.

2. MONGE SALED THAT HE DEED NOT BELLEVE THE UNBITED STATES WOULD INVADE NECARAGUA. YET THE ADMINISTRATION COULD NOT ACCEPT A PRO-SOVERT AND PRO-CUBAN NECARAGUA. NOT WOULD THEREFORE CONTINUE TO DESTABLISE NECARAGUA BY ALMOST ANY MEANS SHORT OF SENDING TROUPS. HE SAND, AN ANSWER TO YOUR QUESTION ABOUT THE MORALITY OF THIS, THAT HES ENTERELY FRANK VIEW AS BETWEEN FRIENDS WAS THAT HE WAS NOT MORAL. BUT HET WAS ALSO UNDERSTANDABLE. THE US HAD PUT OUT FEELERS TO SEE WHETHER THE COMANDANTES MIGHT ACCEPT A YUGOSLAV TYPE SOLUTION. BUT THEY HAD BEEN EVASVE. HOPES OF A PLURALISTIC SOLUTION WERE EVAPORATIONG. MARXHIST LENGINGST REGIMES WERE NOT CAPABLE OF CHANGING DIRECTION.

3. MONGE BELLEVED THAT A SHIFT AWAY FROM THE HAWKS IN WASHINGTON POLICY-MAKING MIGHT INDUCE CERTAIN SHIGHS OF MODERATION IN MANAGUA. BUT HE DID NOT THINK THE FUNDAMENTAL THRUST THERE WOULD BE CHANGED: THE COMANDANTES WERE HAMMATURE, AND THE FACT THAT THERE WERE 9 OF THEM MADE ANY CHANGE OF COURSE HAMFINHTELY DIFFINCULT.
