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PRIME MINISTER NAKASONE'S APPROACH TO THE VENICE SUMMIT

SUMMARY

1. NAKASONE NEEDS A SUCCESSFUL SUMMIT TO SHORE UP HIS DOMESTIC
POLITICAL POSITION. HE APPARENTLY HOPES THAT THE ECONOMIC MEASURES
ANNOUNCED ON 29 MAY AND HIS WILLINGNESS TO SHOW SOLIDARITY WITH OTHER
PARTICIPANTS ON THE POLITICAL ISSUES TO BE DISCUSSED AT VENICE WILL
WARD OFF CIRTICISM OF JAPAN'S ECONOMIC POLICIES. DESPITE HIS
PROTESTATIONS TO THE CONTRARY, NAKASONE IS NOT WELL PLACED AT HOME
TO IMPLEMENT ANY NEW UNDERTAKINGS ENTERED INTO AT THE SUMMIT.

DETAIL

- 2. PRIME MINISTER NAKASONE'S ATTENDANCE AT THE VENICE SUMMIT (AND HIS SUBSEQUENT OFFICIAL VISIT TO SPAIN) IS LIKELY TO BE HIS LAST TRIP ABROAD BEFORE THE EXPIRY OF HIS THIRD TERM AS PRESIDENT OF THE LIBERAL DEMOCRATIC PARTY (LDP) AND HENCE AS PRIME MINISTER, AT THE END OF OCTOBER. HE NEEDS A SUCCESSFUL SUMMIT FROM JAPAN'S POINT OF VIEW TO WARD OFF LATENT DOMESTIC POLITICAL PRESSURE FOR HIS RESIGNATION BEFORE THE FORMAL END OF HIS MANDATE.
- 3. NAKASONE'S DOMESTIC POPULARITY HAS SLUMPED DRAMTICALLY SINCE
 HE LED THE LDP TO A LANDSLIDE VICTORY IN LAST YEAR'S ELECTIONS.
 SUPPORT FOR HIS GOVERNMENT AS REGISTERED BY THE OPINION POLLS REACHED
 ROCK BOTTOM IN THE AFTERMATH OF THE LDP'S SETBACK IN THE APRIL LOCAL
 ELECTIONS. THE ABANDONMENT OF THE GOVERNMENT'S PLANS TO INTRODUCE
 A SALES TAX HAS WON BACK SOME SUPPORT. BUT NAKASONE STILL TRAILS
 WELL BEHIND HIS PARTY IN THE OPINION POLLS. IN THE LATEST ASAHI
 POLL CONDUCTED ON 20-21 MAY, ONLY 31% OF RESPONDENTS EXPRESSED
 SUPPORT FOR THE NAKASONE GOVERNMENT AGAINST 49% WHO WERE OPPOSED.
- 4. NAKASONE'S DOMESTIC POLITICAL POSITION HAS IMPROVED SOMEWHAT
 SINCE HIS VISIT TO WASHINGTON IN EARLY MAY. HIS POTENTIAL SUCCESSORS
 HAVE ACCEPTED THAT NAKASONE IS BEST PLACED TO FULFIL JAPAN'S
 COMMITMENT TO THE AMERICANS AND TO HER OTHER MAIN TRADING PARTNERS
 TO STIMULATE THE JAPANESE ECONOMY. NAKASONE PLAYED A CRUCIAL ROLE
 IN PTTING THE FINISHING TOUCHES TO THE EMERGENCY ECONOMIC
 MEASURES ANNOUNCED ON 29 MAY. BARRING UNFORESEEN DEVELOPMENTS AT
 VENICE, THE MAJORITY OF THE LDP IS NOW WILLING TO SEE HIM REMAIN
 IN OFFICE AT LEAST UNTIL AN EXTRAORDINARY SESSION OF THE DIET,
 EXPECTED TO BE CONVENED INEARLY JULY, HAS PASSED A SUPPLEMENTARY
 BUDGET TO GIVE EFFECT TO THE LATEST PACKAGE OF ECONOMIC MEASURES.
 THIS COULD TAKE 2 OR 3 MONTHS.

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5. NAKASONE'S PRINCIPLA OBJECTIVE AT VENICE WILL BE TO CONVINCE
JAPAN'S SUMMIT PARTNERS THAT JAPAN HAS DONE WHAT SHE CAN IN THE
SHORT-TERM TO SUPPORT THE INTERNATIONAL ECONOMY AND MAKE SOME MOVES
TOWARDS REDRESSING TRADE IMBALANCES BY MEANS OF THE LATEST
ECONOMIC PACKAGE. BUT HE HAS ALSO SHOWN SOME SENSITIVITY TO
CONTINUED FOREIGN CRITICISM OF THE CLOSED NATURE OF JAPAN'S MARKET IN
SOME AREAS. HE HAS SOUGHT EVIDENCE FROM SOME OF US IN THE PAST WEEK
AND MAY THEREFORE COME ARMED WITH A BRIEF DESIGNED TO SHOW HIS
INTEREST IN FURTHER DE-REGULATION IN A NUMBER OF IMPORT PROCEDURES.
IN AN INTERVIEW WITH JOURNALISTS FROM SUMMIT COUNTRIES ON 3 JUNE,
NAKASONE POINTED OUT THAT THE LATEST DOLLARS 43 BILLION STIMULUS
TO THE JAPANESE ECONOMY (EQUIVALENT TO 1.8% OF GNP) WAS
UNPRECEDENTED. JAPAN ALONE COULD NOT REDRESS THE TRADE IMBALANCE.
THE US ALSO NEEDED TO REDUCE THE FEDERAL DEFICIT WHILE EUROPE
SHOULD PRESS AHEAD WITH THE REFORM OF ITS RIGID ECONOMIC STRUCTURE.

6. NAKASONE MUST HOPE THAT THE LATEST ECONOMIC MEASURES WILL BE SUFFICIENT TO TAKE THE SPOTLIGHT OFF JAPAN AT ENICE. HE WILL BE LOOKING TO PRESIDENT REAGAN TO PREVENT THE EMERGENCE OF AN ANTI-JAPANESE US/EUROPE AXIS. JUST AS AT PREVIOUS SUMMITS. NOTABLY WILLIAMSBURG, NAKASONE EVIDENTLY INTENDS TO APPEAL FOR WESTERN SOLIDARITY ON THE POLITICAL ISSUES TO BE DISCUSSED AT VENICE, ESPECIALLY EAST/WEST RELATIONS, NOT ONLY TO WIN FAVOUR WITH REAGAN BUT ALSO TO DULL, IF NOT TO ELIMINATE, CRITICISM OF JAPAN'S ECONOMIC POLICIES. ON INF, THE JAPANESE SHOULD HAVE NO DIFFICULTY IN SUPPORTING WHAT IS ACCEPTABLE TO THE OTHER SUMMIT PARTICIPANTS. PROVIDED THAT JAPAN'S INSISTENCE ON THE NEED FOR GLOBAL REDUCTIONS TO ZERO IN LRINF IS SAFEGUARDED. THE MAIN ELEMENT OF UNCERTAINTY ON THE POLITICAL SIDE IS THE POSSIBILITY THAT JAPAN MAY BE CALLED UPON TO DEMONSTRATE IN A CONCRETE WAY SOLIDARITY WITH THE AMERICANS IN UPHOLDING FREEDOM OF NAVIGATION IN THE GULF. CONSTITUTIONAL AND LEGAL CONSTRAINTS PREVENT JAPAN FROM MAKING ANY DIRECT CONTRIBUTION TO THE US NAVAL PRESENCE IN THE GULF. THE JAPANESE WILL DOUBTLESS BE HOPING THAT EUROPEAN RESERVATIONS ABOUT CLOSER INVOLVEMENT WITH THE AMERICANS WILL PREVENT THEM FROM BECOMING ISOLATED ON THIS ISSUE.

7. NAKASONE'S STRATEGY FOR THE SUMMIT CALLS FOR JAPAN TO KEEP IN CLOSE TOUCH WITH THE US AND THE FRG (AS THE OTHER PARTICIPANT LIKELY TO BE PUT IN THE DOCK OVER ITS ECONOMIC POLICY). NAKASONE HAS ARRANGED BILATERALS WITH REAGAN AND KHL FOR 8 JUNE. BY CONTRAST THE JAPANESE ARE A TRIFLE NERVOUS THAT MRS THATCHER MAY CHOSE TO LAUNCH A BROADSIDE AGAINST JAPAN, ALTHOUGH ON THE STRICTLY BILATERAL ISSUES THERE HAS BEEN SOME MOVEMENT IN RECENT WEEKS IN DIRECTIONS WHICH ARE HELPFUL TO US OVER CABLE AND WIRELESS AND FINANCIAL SERVICES. AND EVEN THE CRUDE VISITBLE TRADE BALANCE IN THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF CALENDAR 1987 SHOWS SIGNS OF DECREASING SLIGHTLY ON AN ANNUALISED BASIS BY COMPARISON WITH 1986. BUT NAKASONE'S GREATEST CONCERN IS THAT OTHER SUMMIT LEADERS WILL WRITE HIM OFF A A LAME DUCK PRIME MINISTER. NOT UNEXPECTEDLY, NAKASONE HAS RESISTED ANY SUCH SUGGESTION. HE MAINTAINS THAT AS HE HAS NO PERSONAL AMBITIONS FOR THE FUTURE HE CAN AFFORD TO TAKE UNPOPULAR DECISIONS. THIS IS HOWEVER ONLY PARTIALLY VALID. AS THE FAILURE OF THE SALES TAX

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TAX PROPOSALS INDICATED, NAKASONE IS POWERLESS IF HE CANNOT CARRY HIS PARTY WITH HIM. SECURING THE COOPERATION OF THE LDP IS LIKELY TO BECOME MORE DIFFICULT AS THE TIME FOR NAKASONE TO STEP DOWN APPROACHES. HE WILL THEREFORE BE RELUCTANT TO ACCEPT ANY SPECIFIC NEW OBLIGATIONS AT VENICE WHICH COULD PRIVE UNPALATABLE TO THE LDP.
