Venice Economic Summit: East/West Declaration

you for your letter No. 07/17 Thank you for your letter AO 87/1574 of 4 June. We have shortened the first of the two additions you suggested to the draft, to avoid any possible leak from Washington which would explicitly link our handling of the Summit with the election campaign. But I think the sense still emerges clearly. We have incorporated the extra clause at the end of paragraph 3(c) as you suggested.

I confirm that the Foreign Secretary is content with our proposed handling of the Declaration.

Venice Economic Summit: East-West Declaration

Thank you for your letter of 3 June, in reply to mine of the same date. I have also seen Charles Powell's letter of the same date.

If the Foreign and Commonwealth Secretary is content with the proposed handling, I am content. But I suggest that you should add an extra sentence at the end of paragraph 1 on the following lines:

"The interest of the media here in the Summit is largely focussed on its possible impact on the Election campaign, and they could be expected to make the most of anything which could be presented as a setback to the Prime Minister's hopes for a successful and harmonious Summit meeting."

and an extra clause at the end of paragraph 2(c) as follows:

"and could have an adverse impact on public perceptions of the Summit, particularly in countries where general elections are imminent".
