The following points have been suggested to me, but I have obviously not had a chance to consult the Foreign Secretary, who has been at Cabinet. 1) page 8, second tiret: delete "better balance of conventional forces at a lower level" and replace with "reduction of the massive Soviet conventional threat in Europe and Asia"; page 8, insert new last tiret: "- encouraged the countries of Eastern Europe to open up their economies and societies"; page 9, insert after "terrorism and hijacking": "We expressed support for practical work underway in the International Civil Aviation Organisation to strengthen international protection against hijacking"; 4) page 9, insert after "both Houses of the Canadian Parliament":

4) page 9, insert after "both Houses of the Canadian Parliament": "and had talks with the Canadian Prime Minister".

I gather that the first paragraph on page 7 on trade debt is not quite right, but that the Treasury are preparing a revision.

The department have pointed out that you have made no mention of the Chairman's statements on the Middle East, Southern Africa and Cambodia. I assume that this is intentional.
