

3. WE HAVE NOT YET RECEIVED A PRECISE PROTOCOL ORDER FROM THE FRENCH AND SO DO NOT YET KNOW WHEN, FOR EXAMPLE, MRS AQUINO WILL REACH THE MUSEE DES MONUMENTS FRANCAIS. BUT THERE IS AN OPPORTUNITY HERE FOR THE PRIME MINISTER TO SPEND A FEW MINUTES WITH HER, AS WITH ANY OTHER HEAD OF DELEGATION WITH WHOM SHE DOES NOT WISH TO HAVE A BILATERAL BUT WHOM SHE WOULD LIKE TO GREET.
